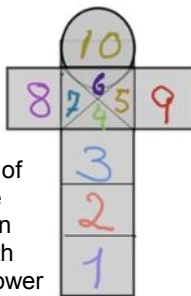

Pastor's Corner:

When you are reading this the ground might still be covered by snow, or at least frozen. But we know that just below the surface there are harbingers of spring, ready to sprout at the first ray of sunshine. When we see the sprouts we know that spring is on its way. And soon we will emerge from our hibernation, with tools to tend our garden furniture and flower pots. It is time for sowing and weeding.



However, when we were younger, the big clean-up wasn't what occupied us. It was more about going out to play without being bundled up until we reached immobility! To be free to jump around, skip rope, or play hopscotch or "hoppe i paradis" (jump into paradise, the Danish name for hopscotch). Actually, it's a strange name, isn't it? Hopscotch or Jump into Paradise! Hopscotch means to hop in a pattern that is scratched or incised into the ground or on a wall. Jumping into paradise was a pattern, like the one in the picture, that we drew with chalk on the sidewalks.

But wait a minute, it is actually the shape of our Church! And it's not a coincidence that when you play hopscotch, you jump in a pattern corresponding to a church's floor plan. The goal is to reach field number 10 without stepping on the lines, and field number 10 is where the altar stands in the Church; that's where God is – that's Paradise!

To move from square to square, you probably remember that you had to toss or push a hopscotch stone/lagger with one foot into the field; it couldn't lie on the lines either – a strange game, isn't it? The Danish art historian Hans Joergen Frederiksen has researched medieval art and expressions and has discovered that the hopscotch stone and the game "Jumping into Paradise" can be traced back to medieval pilgrimages and the many labyrinths, large and small, found in the floors and on the walls of many pilgrimage churches.



Labyrinths are tools for personal, psychological, and spiritual transformation. They have been used as part of spiritual pilgrimage and religious practice for thousands of years worldwide. The oldest known labyrinth is found in Goa, India, and is estimated to be about 4,500 years

old. The best-known pagan labyrinth was built for King Minos of Crete, who used it to hold a monster called the Minotaur.

In other words, labyrinths were not originally Christian art or religious tools. So how did they become part of Christian churches? The best-known Christian example is the labyrinth in the Cathedral of Chartres in France, which dates from the early 13th century and can be walked every Friday in spring and summer.

In the Middle Ages, Greek myth characters were replaced with Christian symbolism, so now the labyrinths were seen as beautiful symbols of life's journey from cradle to grave, symbolizing the path to God (in the centre) and used as a symbolic pilgrimage. Perhaps it also reflects the evangelist John's words: "Jesus said, I am the way, the truth, and the life."

In the Middle Ages, not everyone could take leave from work and embark on a several-months-long pilgrimage through Europe to places like Santiago de Compostela. However, by following the path of a labyrinth with a finger or walking a labyrinth while praying, singing or meditating, one could experience the meaning and significance of one's life and gain insight into oneself, which otherwise would have taken weeks and months on the roads to achieve.



The meaning of the pilgrimage depends on whether it is perceived as a symbol of life's journey! One walks towards the grave in the centre of the labyrinth, and if one has walked with Christ, one can go back out to "a resurrection like His." It may feel overwhelming and difficult sometimes to walk a labyrinth, as if one never reaches the centre, because just as one is very close to the goal, one is led out to the periphery of the intricate figure again. However, this is how a labyrinth reflects life; we never know what tomorrow will be like; but we must keep walking because we are always on our way to God – even when it doesn't look like it.

It is known that during the Easter celebration in Chartres, the priests used to perform a kind of dance into the centre of the labyrinth and out again. Along the way, they threw a small ball to each other, probably as a symbol of bringing their souls along. In the 1500s the church au-

thorities prohibited this "game" because its symbolism originated in pre-Christian times. This was not considered a problem in the Middle Ages.

However, during the Reformation and the Catholic Counter-Reformation, the church authorities were busy reformulating what they stood for, so they purged everything that was not "purely" Christian. The priests' dance was therefore suppressed but not forgotten and survived in the form we call "hopscotch" or "jump into paradise," where the church building is replaced by a drawing of a church nave, transept, choir area, and apse ("Paradise"), and the priests' ball has become a hopscotch stone! Let's jump into Spring!

Our Board has been discussing changes to our constitution and also charitable donations to organizations in our community. These will be presented at our AGM on March 17th for discussion and votes.

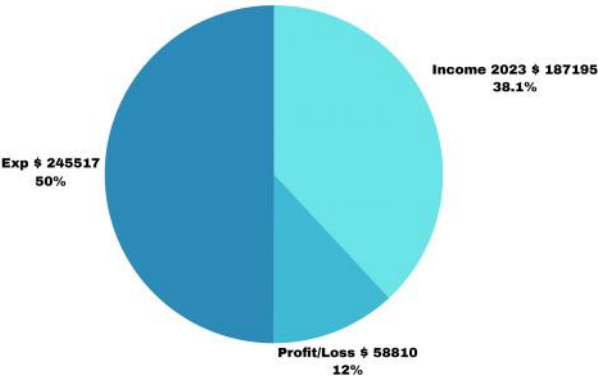
A big thank you to all of those who continue to help out with our many events and ongoing activities! None of these would happen without you.

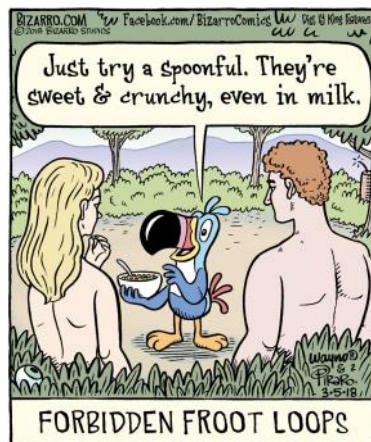

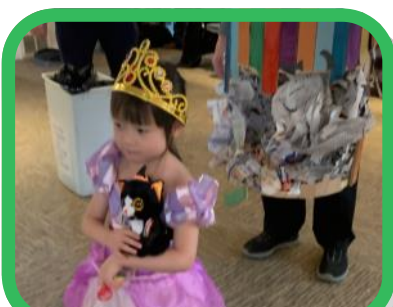

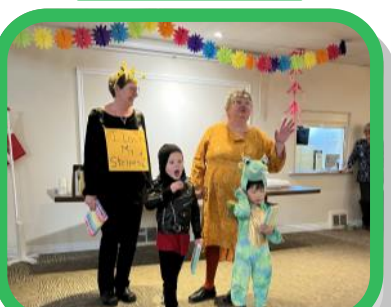
